Historical Timeline of the Ortley Inn


(as established through deeds)

- November 6, 1891—William A. Ostrander bought
 Lots 120,121 and 122 (Ortley Inn and surrounding buildings) from
 the New Brunswick Land Company.
- January 27, 1897—A. Hortpence Swift inherited the same Lots and Inn.
- November 15, 1916—Clifton E. Lord and John Worth purchased above properties from McRee Swift for \$2,200.
- August 18, 1922—John Worth and his wife sold their interest in above to Clifton E. Lord.

Established originally as the Ortley Inn in the late 1880's, the Lord House was subsequently destroyed by fire in 1922. The Lord family purchased the rights to the business and built a single-family home. The Township acquired the land in the late 1960's and constructed a parking lot. The lifeguard station was added later.
